27. Brief Description of Project (Send full project summary & application narrative in PDF)

The Hilltown Glassworks, located in Hilltown Township, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, was one of only a handful of glass manufacturing enterprises operating in colonial North America. In 2006 archaeological work obtained information on the extent and integrity of the surviving archaeological remains associated with the complex. The archaeological investigations encountered both structural remains of the glasshouse complex and other archaeological evidence associated with the Colonial era glass manufacturing process. The site was described in the report completed for the project as being "undoubtedly eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places." Nomination of the site to the National Register was recommended in order to "confer some measure of protection on the site from Federally- and State-funded projects in the future." We would like to use the grant for completing National Register of Historic Places nomination documentation for the site and for moving the nomination through the review process. The NRHP nomination process is very complex and we need professional help to successfully complete it. Therefore we would use the grant to hire Damon Tvaryanas, a highly skilled and experienced historian, to complete the process.

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
