

<p>The Ashland ore dock is one of the most important endangered historic structures in Wisconsin. Built in 1916, it is a feat of architectural and engineering skill, stretching 1,800 feet in length and representing one of the largest docks in the world. Despite its historic significance and its importance as a regional, if not state-wide, landmark, the ore dock is now in the process of being torn down by its current owner, the Canadian National Railway. Lead by the AIHPC and some of its Board members, a strong effort is now underway to save segments of the dock that will educate the public about its history and serve important cultural and economic roles for the community. The grant of \$3,000 will be used to develop educational materials and presentations about the ore dock that hopefully will help preserve it. Even if the preservation effort does not succeed, the documentation produced by the campaign will be of great value for historical and public education purposes, and the information produced will be donated to local libraries and historical societies. The total project cost, including in-kind services, is estimated to be \$9,000. AIHPC will cover the remaining costs and volunteer services above the \$3,000 grant, if awarded.</p>
