27. Brief Description of Project (Send full project summary & application narrative in PDF)

The project aims to study and document the physical remains and changes of the Imperial Sugar complex, a former sugar industrial complex, in Sugar Land, Texas. It will investigate the development, typological aspects, and the preservation issues of the Imperial Sugar campus. Sugar Land flourished as a model company town for the Imperial Sugar Company in the early 20th century. During the 1950s, this status changed. As a result of the expansion of the city of Houston, the company houses and lots at the plantation were sold. The population demographics of the town had been changed: employees for local industries were moved out to a new subdivision called Imperial Estates. In 2002, the activities in the sugar factory and refinery were ended, and in 2010, buildings were partially imploded. In this same year, a proposal for redevelopment and adaptive reuse of the industrial campus was announced. The project aims to produce a series of architectural drawings, diagrams, physical and digital model of the industrial zone, and site analyses of the transformations from a company town model to a postindustrial town located in the suburban Houston.
